The highlight of her tour was enabling USEUCOM support to Estonia during the 2007 cyberattacks.

Previously, Ms. Batiste served as the Theater Chief Information Security Officer for the Defense Intelligence Agency, where she oversaw daily operations of IA/CND programs and portfolios, and its assessments and authorization process. She also served as an advisor to the J6 directorate of USEUCOM on the posture of the Joint Worldwide Intelligence Communications Systems' infrastructure, and as the Information Assurance Manager and Chief of the European IA/CND Branch of the Defense Information Systems Agency.
