With over 25 years of experience in IT policy, strategic planning, and operations across private and public sectors, Jamy Lomento currently serves as the Deputy Assistant Chief Information Officer for the US Forest Service. In this role, Jamy provides national and executive leadership, leading a team of technology and business professionals responsible for the execution of a multimillion-dollar IT portfolio that delivers IT support and services through seven directorates, ranging from application development, land mobile radio, cybersecurity, budget and policy, and customer engagement to enable the vast US Forest Service mission.

Prior to joining the US Forest Service in February of 2022, Jamy spent 16 years with the Department of Homeland Security. During her time at DHS, Jamy held multiple positions with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). As the Mission Support Division Director for FEMA Region 3, Jamy provided strategic direction for multiple programs, including Information Technology, Security, Safety, Human Resources, Performance Management, Contracting, Facilities, and Records Management. In her role as the Information Technology Chief, Jamy led all Regional IT Chiefs as a coordinated management team, serving on multiple FEMA OCIO Policy Working Groups, advising on policy impacts to regional and disaster operations. Jamy was selected as the Disaster Emergency Communications Program Manager where she deployed to numerous national disasters, leading technical teams in the delivery of IT and communications support and services that enabled effective response and recovery efforts, and collaborated with federal, state, and local authorities to overcome communications interoperability challenges. As the Operational Planning Chief, Jamy led collaborative planning teams and guided the development of deliberate catastrophic and incident action plans that dictate the coordinated response of federal agencies incidents arising from the impacts of natural and man-made hazards.

Finally, Jamy served as IT Project Manager for the DHS Office of Intelligence & Analysis (I&A) at the El Paso Intelligence Center (EPIC), Jamy was responsible for leading the development of and representing I&A equities in the creation of the first Law Enforcement Sensitive Cloud Infrastructure known as EPICLink.
